# ADAS ISRAEL SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE UYGHUR CRISIS RESPONSE RESOURCE GUIDE

**Background**: China's treatment of Uyghurs has been declared a genocide by the <u>US</u> government and parliaments in France, Canada, the UK, and elsewhere. Resources below document in horrifying detail the cruelty and scale of these crimes. Other parliaments, including the European Parliament, have recognized a "serious risk" of genocide, a legal term meant to impose prevention obligations under the Genocide Convention. In the US, the Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA) was signed into law in December 2021, and implementation began in June 2022. This law requires companies to ensure that their imported products are not made with forced Uyghur labor and establishes a presumption that goods imported from that region are made with forced Uyghur labor and cannot be imported into the US.

The Adas SAC's Uyghur Crisis Response Team has been active since its inception in early 2021. Several of our major initiatives are below, followed by ways you can take action: these include attending protests, engaging in direct advocacy, signing petitions, supporting your local Uyghur community, and reading and sharing resources. We look forward to seeing you join us in this important work.

## **Year One Achievements**

- Coordinating an <u>open letter</u> from the Jewish community to President Biden, Vice President Harris, Secretary Blinken, and more than a dozen members of Congress. The letter, sent on behalf of more than 200 leaders and organizations, urged the US government to do more to combat the genocide and was delivered hours before Congress reached agreement on the critical Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act. Coverage was extensive in national and Jewish press.

- introduced by Rabbi Krinsky, the panel included a Uyghur survivor and representatives from the Jewish Community Relations Council of Indianapolis, the Uyghur Human Rights Project, and the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.
- Leading protests every single month since March 2021 in front of the Chinese Embassy in Washington DC. We are continually joined by our partners in the Uyghur, Jewish, and interfaith communities at these protest-vigils.

#### 1 -- Protests

## 2 -- Direct Advocacy

- Sens. Menendez (D-NJ) and Rubio (R-FL) have introduced the bipartisan <u>Sanctioning</u> <u>Supporters of Slave Labor Act</u>. This bill would impose secondary sanctions on companies, entities, and individuals that do business with entities sanctioned under the existing Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA). Congressman Jim Banks (R-ID) introduced a companion version of the bill in the House.
  - If you live outside of DC, please urge your Congressional delegation to co-sponsor this bill. If they already do support the bill, thank them. For those of us who live in DC, please ask friends and relatives in states with representation to contact their senators and representatives.
